## MUSIC NOTES



### THE MINISTRY OF MUSIC IS NOT TO BE TAKEN LIGHTLY.

Music is a fair and glorious gift of God. Martin Luther's words—"After Theology there is no art that can be placed on a level with music; for besides theology, music is the only art capable of affording peace and joy of the heart. I wish to see all arts, principally music, in the service of Him who gave and created them."

Through the years I have become aware of the power of instrumental music when it is played with artistry and with care. It has the potential to connect with God in a way words cannot.

We have in our sanctuary a beautiful organ which is a worthy instrument of praise. The piano for many reasons does not meet that criteria and is not the best we can offer Him. It is considered a "practice piano" and should be where that term applies—in the practice room. It has served a purpose for many years but now we aspire to add more artistic notes to our worship services.

Good music doesn't just happen; it needs to be cultivated. It requires good musicians, good instruments and careful integration so that it serves the liturgy well. Its musical offering can then serve the needs of the congregation.

I know that a grand piano adds tonal beauty to all music and would certainly be a joy to play. When good music is given high priority, a church will be blessed with new depths of spirit in prayer and praise.

### ADVANTAGES OF A GRAND PIANO

**Horizontal Configuration:** With the lid fully in the up position the sound of the piano emanates from top and the underside of the piano. The sound reflects off the lid which results in projection.

**Gravity Grand Action:** Because the hammers and dampers return to their resting position by force of gravity rather than pulled back by springs the result is evenness throughout the keyboard. Grand keys are generally longer which results in greater striking force and more control for the player when playing very loud or soft.

The shape of the soundboard is the reason the grand is shaped the way it is which makes it more efficient. The result is great tonal balance and dynamic range throughout the scale of the instrument.

**Action Removal:** The entire key action can easily be removed for ease of regular maintenance, such as regulation adjustment and voicing.

### A NEW CHOIR ROOM

We thank Heather and Chad Stayko for willingly moving out of the youth room providing the choir with a much needed choir room. The facilities will accommodate all groups who use this room for rehearsals and musical events. The practice piano now in the sanctuary will be moved to that room as soon as we can purchase a grand for use in the sanctuary.

The piano fund for a grand piano has been initiated but needs your help to make our goal a reality. The progress chart is in the narthex and we hope and pray that we can color our keyboard very soon. By contributing with your gifts or memorials you will show your support of the music ministry. Checks can be made to the church designated for the piano fund.

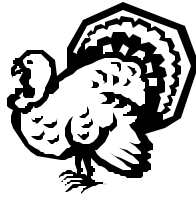
## MILITARY NEWS Does anyone at Bethany have news of relatives in the military?
